



Policy on Independent Pathway Active Training

1. Purpose

This purpose of this policy is to outline the ACRRM requirements for Independent Pathway registrars with regard to maintaining active training.

2. Related documentation

3. Policy

3.1 Registrars on the Independent Pathway are required to be actively engaged in training and progressing through assessments at a reasonable pace.

3.2 Once a training position is accepted registrars must try and start training at the beginning of the training year.

Registrars who have accepted a position on the pathway can defer commencement of training for a maximum of 6 months, to allow them time to confirm a position in a suitable training post. This must be approved by ACRRM at the time of accepting a place on the pathway.

3.3 Registrars who are required to complete training time must:

- pay training fees as outlined in the Fees Schedule and Policy
- attend at least 13 out of the 16 tutorials each six months. Live attendance is expected but listening to recorded sessions occasionally is acceptable;
- gain a pass (minimum of 80%) in at least 13 post tutorials assessments each six months;
- attend at least four out of the five days of workshop each six months. If unable to attend an alternative way to address these knowledge areas must be negotiated with the Medical Educator;
- participate in education sessions with Medical Educator; and
- be in an accredited post within six months of commencement of training year.

3.4 All registrars must enrol in and attempt at least one ACRRM summative assessment each year (if eligibility requirements are met).

3.5 Failure to comply with these requirements may result in withdrawal from the pathway.
