

WE HAVE TEAMS IN HOBART AND MELBOURNE WORKING HARD TO:

- Build a national and international campaign on Tasmania's Tarkine, calling for its recognition as a National Park and World Heritage area by 2020
- Protect Tasmania's Wilderness World Heritage from the Tasmanian Government's plans to log, mine and allow insensitive development of mega tourism
- Lead a national campaign to end the industrial scale logging of Australia's native forests
- Run an international solidarity campaign with the indigenous peoples of Sarawak, Borneo who are fighting for land rights, human rights and for protection from logging and mega-dams

• Defend critical Bruny island habitat of the swift parrot, on the verge of extinction, from destructive clearfell logging



THE TARKINE IN FOCUS



At the heart of the Tarkine is Australia's largest tract of cool temperate rainforest, threaded with wild rivers, flowing between mountain ranges and through expansive button grass plains. Wild flowers bloom along the rugged wild coastline with its windswept beaches, towering sand dunes and rich ancient Aboriginal history.

The Australia Heritage Council found the Tarkine to be of outstanding heritage value with its rainforests linking back to the ancient continent of Gondwana, and lichens and fossils which help tell the story of Australia's ancient flora and its evolution.

Despite these globally and nationally significant values, logging and mining threaten to decimate unique intact ecosystems in both the rainforest and ancient eucalypts.

Tarkine Future 2020. Our campaign calling for it recognition and protection as a National Park and World Heritage area.

Our Foundation is building a national and international campaign to bring forward the day when the Tarkine's 450,000 hectares gets the respect, status and protection it warrants as a prime part of Australia's, and the world's, surviving cultural and natural heritage.

We are coordinating cultural, scientific and adventure events in the Tarkine, developing campaign films and literature and working on the compelling economic arguments in favour of protection. We aim to build a strong campaign right across the mainland as well as in Tasmania.

ACTION STATIONS

In our short history, Bob Brown Foundation is proud to have played an active role in securing these wonderful wins for the planet and initiating:

- Protection of endangered wildlife, irreplaceable Aboriginal culture and remote community at sacred James Price Point in the Kimberley, Western Australia from Woodside's ill-considered destructive gas hub
- Prevention of the delisting of 74,000 hectares of pristine forest from Tasmania's Wilderness World Heritage Area home to the world's most intact temperate forests including the tallest hardwood trees on earth
- The Bob Brown Foundation's national annual environmental awards
