ACRRM invites applications from organisations passionate about building a sustainable local healthcare workforce in areas of need. GP practices, health services, local councils, community organisations, and other groups are encouraged to apply.

What Kind of Projects Can Be Funded?

Funding supports a wide-range of community-led initiatives that directly assist doctors completing ACRRM Fellowship training. Projects must be located in communities classified as rural and remote under Modified Monash (MM) categories MM 4 to MM 7. Project priority areas include:



Education and training

Initiatives enhancing the support for doctors within a community. Examples include remote supervision and support, providing childcare or school education support.



First Nations community support

Initiatives that strengthen healthcare delivery, training, or workforce within Aboriginal Medical Services (AMS) or Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Services (ACCHS).



Recruitment and retention

Projects designed to attract doctors and keep them long term. This might include needs analysis, accommodation solutions or community orientation programs.



University partnerships and training pathway development

Collaborative efforts to support medical students and early-career doctors transitioning into ACRRM Rural Generalist training.
