Multiple Choice Question (MCQ)

2023A

Purpose

This public report provides information for candidates, supervisors, educators and training organisations and is produced following each Multiple-Choice Question (MCQ) exam. It includes information on the conduct, outcome, statistics and commentary for the most recent delivery of the exam. Past public reports are available on the ACRRM website.

Introduction

The MCQ is a written assessment which assesses recall, reasoning and applied clinical knowledge. In particular it focuses on assessing the ability to manage medical care in a rural or remote environment. The assessment aims to cover all domains of rural and remote practice and is one of the summative assessments for CGT.

Overall Outcome


A total of 88 candidates sat the 2023A MCQ exam. 71 of the 88 candidates passed. The overall pass rate was 80.7%.

Assessment Statistics

All 125 questions were evaluated using psychometrics, resulting in 0 questions being identified as poor performing and no questions were removed from the examination. The Angoff cut score was applied. Below is a summary of the assessment statistics:

Cronbach Alpha (desirable if in the range 0.7-0.9) is the measurement of reliability and internal consistency, the effect of measurement error on the observed score of a student cohort rather than on an individual student.

2023A Cronbach Alpha = 0.751 (higher than previous exams)

Standard error of measurement (SEM; smaller = better) is a measure of the "spread" of scores within a student had that one student been tested repeatedly; the effect of measurement error on the observed score of an individual student.

2023A SEM = 4.61/125 = 3.7% (consistent with previous exams)

Conduct of the Exam

The 2023A exam was held on 22 February 2023 and was delivered in pencil and paper format. A total of 88 candidates were registered for this exam and completed this attempt.

Candidates based in Australia, and remotely around the world undertook the exam remotely in their own locations rather than central exam centres.

Venues and invigilators were required to be officially approved by ACRRM and met the standards required for MCQ exams.

The examination was conducted over three hours and 125 multiple choice questions are presented. There are no negative marks for incorrect answers.

Questions mostly consist of a clinical case presentation, a brief targeted lead-in question and four options from which candidates are required to choose the single best option. The stem of the clinical case may include text and images. Sample questions may be found on the ACRRM website.

Overview Grading and Scoring

The pass mark is set using the Modified Angoff method; therefore the pass mark varies between each exam depending on the difficulty of the questions. Standard post-examination analysis is performed to identify and manage statistically poorly performing questions.

Questions answered correctly by Curriculum Area and Year – 2023A

Another way to compare cohorts is to review the percentage of questions answered correctly for each curriculum area, to see if any particular cohort is/was unexpectedly stronger or weaker in the 34 examined areas. This cohort of 88 candidates showed strengths in ADD, DERM, EM, MSK, OPH, PAED, PRO and SURG. The law of small number statistics should be applied as some areas of the curriculum have fewer than three questions.

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Candidates and Educators guidance

The commentary is provided to assist candidates in preparation for this exam and educators who are supporting candidates. Brief individualised feedback (coaching reports) are routinely provided.

All enrolled MCQ candidates receive access to the 125 question Multiple Choice Question Familiarisation Activity (MCQFA) approximately one month prior to the MCQ exam.

The MCQFA was last updated in December 2019 and now contains references and rationale for correct and incorrect answer options. The questions appearing in the MCQFA have previously appeared on summative MCQ exams. The 125 MCQFA now more closely resembles a summative MCQ examination, with respect to the level of difficulty and content assessed.

In addition, ACRRM's "Introduction to MCQ Assessment" online module on Canvas, available all year round to people with access to ACRRM's online learning portal, was first made available in January 2020. This module gives insight into how an exam is assembled, how individual questions are structured, and offers guidelines to developing practice MCQs.

Evaluation

Following the assessment, candidates are encouraged to provide feedback via an online survey. Feedback is reviewed and considered accordingly and may be used to drive continuous improvement and improve candidate and examiner experience for future assessments.

Based on feedback of candidates from the 2023A cohort, the following themes were identified:

- The information provided by ACRRM was timely and clear, including understanding the process for locating an appropriate venue and invigilator.
- Not having to travel to sit assessments is preferred by the candidates.
- Ease of enrolment process and provision of sufficient information to make an informed decision to enrol.
- The information and Q&A sessions were found to be very useful to understand the pencil and paper delivery.
- Invigilators continue to be supported and equipped with the necessary information to assist with the assessment requirements and support ACRRM Registrars.
