FACT SHEET

WHAT ARE MULTIPLE MINI INTERVIEWS?

Multiple Mini Interviews (MMIs) consist of eight individual interviews conducted at separate stations. Candidates have two minutes to read a question before entering each interview station and eight minutes to communicate the proposed course of action or ideas in relation to that question. A new question is presented by a new interviewer at each station.

ABOUT THE INTERVIEWERS

Interviewers include Australian College of Rural and Remote Medicine (ACRRM) representatives and Fellows of ACRRM. Interviewers have not read your application or written submission, so please ensure you provide examples of your experiences and demonstrate your professional approach across a range of contexts.

TIPS ON ANSWERING MMI QUESTIONS

During the interview, you should aim to answer each question by referring to the best examples from your own experiences that demonstrate how you fit the selection criteria.

Things to consider:

- What the experience was?
- When did this experience occur? (please be specific)
- Where were you at the time of this experience and for how long you were there? (e.g. I was on an 8-week placement at a rural clinic in Bathurst NSW)
- What did you do?
- How did you do it? (if applicable)

If the question asks for your plans, you should state specifically:

- What actions you plan to take?
- How you plan to undertake these actions?
- When you plan to undertake these action?
- Why you chose to undertake these actions?
